# 2 Peter - Previously

Our past 2 lessons, we have addressed 2
 Peter 2:1-3, where Peter has warned that there will be false teachers among us.

 We discussed some of their character based upon the text.

Tonight, we find out what is the fate of false teachers before God.

- He did not spare angels who sinned
- We know little about angels. Related to our text:
- They are messengers of God sent to help His people - Hebrews 1:14
  - Involved in judgments cf. Matthew 13:39-42, Genesis 19:1, etc.
  - Created with (some) freewill text, Jude 6
  - Demons are possibly fallen angels cf. Matthew 8:29

- Cast them down to hell and delivered them into chains of darkness
- Held for judgment
- "Hell" ταρταροω (tartaroō) Tartarus.
   Only here in NT.
  - Thayer, the Greeks answer to Gehenna for the Jews.
  - Describes the place of the punishment of the wicked after life.

- Cast them down to hell and delivered them into chains of darkness
- "Chains of darkness"; "pits of darkness"
   (NASB); "chains of gloomy darkness" (ESV).
- In some way, they were being restrained or confined.

- Reserved for judgment rebellious angels, as with rebellious man, are awaiting a final judgment.
   Jude 6
- There is a day of reckoning coming Acts 17:30-31, Matthew 25:31ff,
   2 Corinthians 5:10, Romans 14:10-12, etc.
- IF God will punish angelic beings, he will punish us as well.

Cf. Matthew 25:41, Revelation 20:10, 14-15

## The world destroyed by flood - 2:5

- He did not spare the ancient world
- The flood as recorded in Genesis 6-8
- Gen. 6:5-7, 11-12 the world was very wicked. God determined a day.
- Noah found grace Genesis 6:8
   He built an ark saving him and his family (eight people). NOTE: The Greek is the word for eighth (not "with 7 others"), though that is factually correct.
   1 Peter 3:20-21 eight souls

## The world destroyed by flood - 2:5

- Noah, a preacher of righteousness
- Genesis 6:9, Noah was a just man, perfect in his generation. He walked with God.
   Hebrews 11:7 a man of faith.
- Our text mentions a fact not previous mentioned

   a preacher of righteousness. Likely, this is what
   he did as he prepared the ark WARNING the
   people of coming judgment.

### The world destroyed by flood - 2:5

- Flooding the world of the ungodly.
- God judged and cleansed the world, in essence starting over with Noah and his family.
   BUT He knew who belonged to Him.

## Sodom and Gomorrah - 2:6-8

- Turned into ashes
- Genesis 19 describes the destruction of Sodom (and surrounding valley).
- The city was so perverted with immorality (homosexuality **Jude 7, Genesis 19**). Not even 10 righteous were found in the city.
- Genesis 19:24, God rained fire and brimstone utterly destroying the area

### Sodom and Gomorrah - 2:6-8

- Making them an example
- 2 Peter 2:6, Jude 7, WARNING us of the fate of the ungodly

## Sodom and Gomorrah - 2:6-8

- Delivered righteous Lot
- 2 Peter 2:7-8, We know Lot had some issues.
  - He chose that land, even though it was corrupt
  - Genesis 13:10-13.
- But he was a righteous man whose soul was tormented by the wickedness around him.
   He served YHWH, but his choices came with a cost, including much of his family!

- He knows how to deliver the godly out of temptation
- IF He could deliver Lot, He can deliver us
- 1 Corinthians 10:13
- The Lord knows who belongs to Him 2 Timothy 2:19 (cf. John 10:27,
   1 Corinthians 8:3, etc.

- And to reserve under punishment the unjust for the day of judgment.
- As noted, there is a day of judgment coming!
- Matthew 25:31, 46 the righteous and wicked will be separated and assigned their eternal reward.

- TAKE note of these 3 examples!
- These are extreme examples of God's judgment, BEFORE the end of earthly time!
- Peter relates these to how God feels about false teachers.
- IF that be so, how should WE react to false teachers?

Ephesians 5:11, Galatians 2:4-5 Give them time to repent - Titus 3:10-11, Revelation 2:20-23, but...

- Especially those who walk according to the flesh
- Peter concludes, describing the nature of their conduct.
- In our next lesson we will develop this noting how God views false teachers

Understand that false teachers CAN repent (Paul, Apollos, etc.), but if not, they will face God's wrath, and so will those who follow after them (cf. 2 Thessalonians 2:11-12)

Where do you stand in God's eyes?
