


#### The gospel of Luke and prayer

- The gospel of Luke emphasizes prayer
- Jesus prayed at His baptism (Luke 3:21-22)
- He prayed all night before choosing His apostles (Luke 6:12)
- He prayed for Peter (Luke 22:31-32)
- On the cross (Luke 23:34)
- 3 parables (Luke 11:5-10, 18:1-14)
- Luke 11:1, "Lord teach us to pray..."

- The subject of prayer is an important one!
- A crucial part of the Christian's life
- Our "prayer life" correlates with our relationship with God
- It was part of the lives of many Biblical characters, including Jesus
- A subject emphasized extensively in scripture

- Simply stated, prayer is the way God has provided for us to communicate with Him
- · Communication is a 2-way street.
- Through prayers, we communicate our needs, requests, acknowledgments, praise and thanksgiving.

- God is the originator of prayer
- Isaiah 55:6
- "Calling on the name of the Lord" –
  first usage Genesis 4:26. See Gen. 12:8,
  13:4, 1 Kings 18:24 (36-38)
  Can include prayer in context

- Prayer begins with God
- He wants us to pray to Him 1 Peter 5:7

1 John 5:14-15

Luke 18:1

Psalm 145:18

Proverbs 15:8

- "Prayer" and "pray" in scripture
- Together found about 374 times, plus other words that are associated with prayer.
- Προσεύχομαι (proseuchomai) the most prominent word – found 140x in NT. Means to utter prayers. Always directed to God.
- Δεομαι (deomai) ~40x in NT.
   Prayers, supplications, requests –
   James 5:16, 1 Peter 3:12
   1 Timothy 2:1, Philippians 4:6

- "Prayer" and "pray" in scripture
- ἔντευξις (enteuxis) intercessions.
  1 Timothy 2:1, 4:5
- εὐχαριστία (eucharistia) giving of thanks,
   thanksgiving 1 Timothy 4:4,
   Colossians 4:2
- Etc. In these and other words, we find the importance of prayer and some of what it involves.

- Because it is commanded!
- 1 Thessalonians 5:17, James 5:13, 16
- Romans 12:12, Colossians 4:2

  Ephesians 6:18 not only is it commanded, but it is to be done often!
- Prayer is also necessarily implied, and demonstrated by example

- Because God wants me to talk to Him
- 1 Thessalonians 5:17, James 5:13, 16
- God is accessible Acts 17:26-27
- His acceptance of Jesus as intercessor points to this – Hebrews 7:25

- Because it is a privilege granted to the righteous
- If I am living as I ought, God is there to fulfill His part to my needs and requests

**James 5:16** 

1 Peter 3:12 (Psa. 34:12-16)

- Because I am grateful
- Gratitude is lacking in our selfish & entitled society.
- If I appreciate God, I ought to desire to express that gratitude to Him
  - 2 Corinthians 4:15
  - 1 Thessalonians 5:17-18
  - Cf. Colossians 4:2, Philippians 4:6

- Because I have needs only He can provide, and others He MIGHT provide
- Forgiveness 1 John 1:9, Acts 8:22-24
- 1 John 5:14-15 If I ask anything according to His will, He hears us...

- Because it puts me in my place
- Humility is crucial to proper prayer.
   I must realize who God is and who I am (and am not)
- Matthew 5:3 poor in Spirit
- Psalm 8:4, What is man that You are mindful of Him ...?
