


A study of prayer!

David, a man of prayer

- David is mentioned more in scripture than anyone else, except Jesus.
- He is described as, "a man after God's own heart: (Acts 13:22, cf. 1 Samuel 13:14, 16:7)
- It is evident that prayer was a part of this

David prayed throughout his life

- 1 Samuel 23:11, fleeing from Saul
- **Psalm 142**, penned by David in a cave fleeing from Saul. He cried out to the LORD with his voice and made supplication
- 2 Samuel 7:27-29, as the LORD promises to establish his kingdom (vs. 18-29)
- 2 Samuel 12:16, praying for his dying son

David prayed throughout his life

- 2 Samuel 15:31, David escaping Jerusalem because of the rebellion of Absalom. He prays that God defeat the counsel of Ahithophel, an advisor of Absalom, and now his enemy
- 2 Samuel 24:10, 17, after sinfully numbering the people, he prays (again) in repentance

David prayed throughout his life

• **Psalm 62:8,** David encourages others to pray. Trust in Him at all times, you people; Pour out your heart before Him; God is a refuge for us. Selah



- David often declared that he would pray to God
- **Psalm 4:1,** Hear me when I call, O God of my righteousness! You have relieved me in my distress; Have mercy on me, and hear my prayer.
- Psalm 5:1-2, Give ear to my words, O Lord, Consider my meditation. Give heed to the voice of my cry, My King and my God, For to You I will pray.

- David often declared that he would pray to God
- **Psalm 6:9,** The LORD has heard my supplication; The LORD will receive my prayer.

- David often declared that he would pray to God
- Psalm 17:1-3, Hear a just cause, O LORD, Attend to my cry; Give ear to my prayer which is not from deceitful lips. Let my vindication come from Your presence; Let Your eyes look on the things that are upright. You have tested my heart; You have visited me in the night; You have tried me and have found nothing; I have purposed that my mouth shall not transgress...

- David often declared that he would pray to God
- Psalm 35:1, 13, David prayed for his enemies. Plead my cause, O LORD, with those who strive with me; Fight against those who fight against me... But as for me, when they were sick, My clothing was sackcloth; I humbled myself with fasting; And my prayer would return to my own heart.

- David often declared that he would pray to God
- Psalm 55:16-17, David again dealing with his enemies, trusts God. Give ear to my prayer, O God, And do not hide Yourself from my supplication.... As for me, I will call upon God, And the LORD shall save me. Evening and morning and at noon I will pray, and cry aloud, And He shall hear my voice.

- David praised God
- **Psalm 36:5-10,** David, in a psalm describing the wicked, then proceeds to praise God for His mercy, righteousness, faithfulness, lovingkindness, etc.

- David praised God
- Psalm 138:1-2, I will praise You with my whole heart; Before the gods I will sing praises to You. I will worship toward Your holy temple, And praise Your name For Your lovingkindness and Your truth; For You have magnified Your word above all Your name.
- There are many things about which God is worthy of praise

- David thanked God
- **Psalm 30**, a song of dedication of the House of David. Not specifically identified as BY David, but it is likely as he dedicates his own house.
- Psalm 100, another psalm that calls for us to thank God
- After praising God for who He is, thank
 Him for what He has done for and in you.
 1 Thessalonians 5:18

- David prayed in confession & repentance
- **Psalm 38**, There are about 5 penitential psalms of David. Most prominent is **Psalm 51**.
- 1 John 1:9 calls for us, as believers, to confess our sins in repentance, and He will forgive us.
- Also, in these psalms we are reminded that we cannot hide from God.

 (Hebrews 4:13, cf. Psalm 139:7, etc.)

- David prayed for vindication
- Psalm 26, The occasion is not mentioned.
 David had many opportunities and he put them in God's hands.

- David prayed for deliverance
- **Psalm 143**, Again, we do not know the occasion. But David pleads with YHWH to hear his prayer and supplications (earnest pleadings).
- When we are in distress and discouragement for being mistreated, turn to Him
 (1 Peter 5:7, cf. Romans 12:14-21.)

What can we learn from David's prayers?

- NOTE that David was described as "a man after God's own heart" BEFORE we are introduced to him. He was already faithful to God. He communicated with God.
- We learn from David HOW to pray! Do you want to learn how to pray better?
 Read the psalms.
- If needed, write out your prayers!
