



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# Prayer in the Law of Moses

- The Law of Moses does not give specific instructions about praying to God. **HOWEVER:**
  - It is certainly implied
  - Likely, as the LOM was given, praying to God was always understood (e.g., Abraham)



# Prayer in the Law of Moses

- The Law of Moses does not give specific instructions about praying to God. HOWEVER:
- Sacrifices were about approaching YHWH –  
**cf. Hebrews 13:15** – sacrifice of praise
- The priesthood was given to approach God - We are now priests  
**(1 Peter 2:5, 9)**
- Crying out to YHWH for restoration –  
**Exodus 22:22-23, Leviticus 26:40-42**



# Prayer in the Law of Moses

## Moses was a man of prayer

- He spoke with God “face to face”  
**Numbers 12:7-8**
- **Exodus 8:29, 9:28-29, 10:17-18** – Entreating the LORD for Pharaoh
- **Exodus 15:22-25** – at the bitter waters of Marah



# Prayer in the Law of Moses

**Moses was a man of prayer**

- **Numbers 10:34-36**, as the people moved from one place to another
- **Numbers 11:2**, as fire broke outside the camp
- **Numbers 12:13**, when Miriam was struck with leprosy
- **Numbers 16:15-16**, Korah's rebellion



# Prayer in the Law of Moses

## Moses was a man of prayer

- **Numbers 21:7**, as fiery serpents are sent into the camp
- **Deuteronomy 9:20, 26**, He prayed for Aaron, recounting the golden calf incident
- **Psalm 90**, the psalm of Moses



# Prayer in the Law of Moses

- Throughout the Old Testament, we find faithful followers of the Law praying to God.
- This shows it was something they understood and expected to do.



# People who prayed

## Abraham was a man of prayer

- **James 2:23**, he was called “the friend of God”
- He “called on the name of the LORD” – **Genesis 12:8, 13:4, 21:33.**  
This would have included prayer
- **Genesis 20:7, 17**, he prayed for Abimelech
- IN Abraham we see prayer preceding the Law of Moses



# People who prayed

## Hannah, a woman of prayer

- **1 Samuel 1:10-12**, in bitterness of soul she prays to the LORD for a son. She vows to dedicate him to the Lord
- Her prayer is answered and Samuel is born. When he was weaned, she brought him to the temple where he was dedicated to serve God – **1 Samuel 1:26-28**



# People who prayed

## Hannah, a woman of prayer

- **1 Samuel 2:1-8**, a prayerful psalm
- Here we see that women also ought to pray  
**(cf. Acts 16:13)**

Also, KEEP your vows to God

**(Ecclesiastes 5:4-7)**



# People who prayed

## Solomon, dedicating the temple

- He started right. Given wisdom by God. Built the temple, following God's instructions
- **1 Kings 8:22-52**, at the dedication of the temple Solomon prays.
  - Praising God's greatness
  - May the temple be a place where He would answer prayers
  - When men repented and turned to Him there, remember



# People who prayed

## Elijah, a man of prayer

- A prophet during some of Israel's darkest times
- **1 Kings 17:20-22**, he raises the son of a widow
- **1 Kings 18:36-38**, at Mt. Carmel, confronting the prophets of Baal
- **1 Kings 17:1-7, 18:41-46** – drought.  
See **James 5:16-18**
- NOT all prayers of the faithful are recorded



# People who prayed

## Elijah, a man of prayer

- **1 Kings 19:4**, He is tired and discouraged, but he doesn't want to live anymore.  
The LORD addresses his request, but FIRST...
  - Here is an example of praying to God
    - He is told to wait and keep working
    - His request is granted DIFFERENTLY, but better!



# People who prayed

## Daniel, a man of prayer

- **Daniel 2:17-19**, before telling and interpreting the dream of Nebuchadnezzar, he prays and fasts, along with his brethren. He blesses the God of heaven
- **Daniel 6:10-11**, he prayed 3 times a day, with his window open toward Jerusalem. He did not hide his faith. Cast into the lion's den but delivered.



# People who prayed

## Daniel, a man of prayer

- **Daniel 9:3-19**, as Darius becomes king, Daniel understands the timing of Jeremiah's prophecy (70 years in captivity).  
He prays to God, with fasting and sackcloth.
  - A prayer of repentance for him & the people
  - He appeals to the Lord's righteousness, mercy and forgiveness**17-19** – he prays for restoration  
**20-21** – the LORD answers him



# People who prayed

## Ezra, the book and the man

- **Ezra 3:11**, as the site for rebuilding the temple is dedicated, they gave thanks to the LORD and sang.
- When Ezra arrives (**ch. 7**, ~55 years later) he helps restore worship.  
**Ezra 8:21-23**, preparing to travel to Jerusalem, they prayed and fasted



# People who prayed

## Ezra, the book and the man

- **Ezra 10:1**, Ezra and the people are praying, confessing their sins, having unlawfully married. They addressed the issue.
- Sometimes we face hard decisions, especially repentance. We should pray.



# People who prayed

## Nehemiah, a godly leader of prayer

- The book deals with rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem (~20 years after the conclusion of Ezra's arrival and restoration)
- **Nehemiah 1:4-11**, he hears of Jerusalem's deplorable condition and prays
  - Accountability and repentance
  - Humble requests
  - Recalling God's promises



# People who prayed

## Nehemiah, a godly leader of prayer

- **Nehemiah 2:4**, when asked by the king of his request, he first prays
- **Nehemiah 4:4-5**, facing resistance from enemies, he prays that God defeats their evil plans
- **Nehemiah 5:19**, “Remember me, my God, for good...”



# People who prayed


## Nehemiah, a godly leader of prayer

- **Nehemiah 8:6**, with Ezra who read the law and “blessed the LORD, the great God.”
- **Nehemiah 13:14, 22, 31**, “Remember me, my God, for good...” (3x)
- **Nehemiah 13:29**, Remember them, the ungodly who had defiled the priesthood



# What can we learn from these examples?

- **Luke 18:1**, prayer has ALWAYS been a part of God's plans. He desires that we pray!
- **Cf. Hebrews 12:1**, “surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses...”. We find great examples of when and how to pray.
- If you desire to learn how to improve your prayers, read and study the prayers of godly men and women.  
HOW to praise, attitude, what to pray for, etc.
