We defined "discipleship" (a word not found in the NT) as the state of being a disciple or the process of becoming a committed follower of Jesus



Last week, we began examining being a disciple of Christ.

We examined **Luke 9:23-24**. A disciple of Jesus must:

- * Desire it
- * Deny himself
- * Take up his cross
- * Follow Jesus





Closer to God (45)

Luke 14:26-33

- Jesus is headed toward Jerusalem
 (Luke 9:51). If so, His followers have been with Him for awhile.
- He now calls for true commitment.
- This is a SERIOUS decision

Luke 14:26-33

- If <u>anyone</u> comes to Me
- And does not <u>hate</u> his family Is Jesus advocating hatred of family?
- Jesus taught that we love everyone
 - Matthew 22:37-39.
- Jesus did not hate others –
 John 3:16, Romans 5:6-8

Luke 14:26-33

Are we to hate our family?

Jesus kept the LOM perfectly –which called for honoring parents - Exodus 20:7
 (cf. Ephesians 6:2)

 On the cross, He made provisions for Mary – John 19:26-27

He even taught loving enemies
 Matthew 5:43-45

Luke 14:26-33 – "Hate father..."
What did Jesus mean?

- This was likely a statement to shock and provoke serious consideration
- The point is that we must love less anyone or anything that hinders our discipleship

Cf. Matthew 10:34-37 Matthew 19:29

Luke 14:26-33 – "Hate father..."
What did Jesus mean?

- Consider Genesis 29:31-33
 Leah was unloved (lit. hated)
 Did Jacob hate her or lover her less than Rachel? (She was mother of 7 of his children)
- Psalm 5:5, "You hate all workers of iniquity", yet He loves all mankind

Luke 14:26-33 - "Hate father..."

What did Jesus mean?

The point: To be His disciple, He must come first! Before any relationship or possession or resource we have!

- Luke 14:26-33 "Hate...his own life"
- Again, a willingness to sacrifice even our life if needed.
- Should we really hate ourselves?
 Ephesians 5:28-29
 Cf. Luke 9:24-25
 - whoever desires to save his life will lose it
- WHAT are we willing to die for?

Luke 14:26-33 – "Hate...his own life"

- Again, consider priorities. What will you sacrifice or give up for Him?
- Romans 12:1
 Luke 18:22 the rich, young ruler was told to see all his possessions.
 Why?
- Does He come before money, comforts, hobbies, relationships, our pride?

Luke 14:26-33 -Take up his cross -

 We addressed this in our last lesson (Luke 9:23) – a willingness to suffer affliction and hardships for Him

- Luke 14:26-33 Counting the cost
- We must take our discipleship seriously
- 2 Illustrations given
 - building a tower 28-30
 - a king going to war 31-32
- While being a disciple is free, it will cost you everything!

Luke 14:26-33 -

Whoever does not forsake all that he has, cannot be My disciple

- This is total commitment!
- Are you willing to give up whatever hinders?
 - * Will you sacrifice comforts for Him and your brethren?
 - * Will you sacrifice resources?
 - * Will you give up ANYTHING at all?
- Is that ONE THING standing in your way?

Abiding in His word

John 8:31-32

If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed.

Being a disciple is tied to making His word our home!

2 John 9-11

His word includes the teachings of the

apostles

(cf. Galatians 1:11-12,

Ephesians 3:3-5)

1 Thessalonians 2:13

Abiding in His word

John 8:31-32

If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed.

 Abiding also implies that we are DOING what He says! We are living it!

Matthew 28:19-20 James 1:21-25

• Hebrews 10:24-25 - we will NOT neglect assembling!

Love for one another

John 13:34-35

By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.

In a hostile world, we need each other!

Do you prefer your brethren?

Romans 12:10

1 Peter 2:17

Philippians 2:3-4

Love for one another

John 13:34-35

By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.

- Jesus gave us His example,
 "As I have loved you..."
- This will be evident to others "By this" implies they have the right to judge us in this!

Bearing fruit

John 15:8

By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples.

 Bearing fruit means we are productive!

John 15:8 What is fruit?

- Reaching souls Mark 16:15,
 2 Corinthians 5:11, Acts 5:42,
 8:4, etc.
- Any area of growth –
 Knowledge 2 Peter 3:18
 Good works Titus 2:14
 Relationships
 Character Gal. 5:22-23
 Righteousness Heb. 12:1

Bearing fruit

John 15:8 What is fruit?

- Colossians 1:10, that you may walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God;
- A disciple is going to be growing and maturing!
