WHEN DID THE CHURCH BEGIN? Matthew 16:18

Introduction

In our recent Gospel Meeting with Micky Galloway, he presented 3 lessons about the church...

One was entitled, "What the Angels Saw in the Church". Based on **Ephesians 3:10-11 & 1 Peter 1:12.**

One point in that lesson mentioned that they saw the beginning of the church on Pentecost.

When Did The Church Begin?

WHEN DID THE CHURCH BEGIN? Matthew 16:18

- Establishing the eternal plans of God is seen in various prophecies in scripture.
- True prophecy is only attributable to one who can foresee and control the future Deity!
- True prophecy is not vague
 - cf. Isaiah 41:21-23

Isaiah 2:1-3

Written around 725 BC and challenging their idolatry, Isaiah calls for repentance. BUT he also offers a future time when God would establish His kingdom.

Isaiah 2:1-3

- WHEN "In the latter days" ("last days" NASB)
- **WHAT** "The mountain of the LORD's house" would be established.
- WHO "all nations" and "many people" (not exclusive to Israel)

When Did The Church Begin?

Isaiah 2:1-3

WHERE – "Out of Zion" Jerusalem

Zion was a name for Jerusalem, primarily

where the temple was built.

Mostly found in prophecy and the psalms, it typically had a spiritual component – the place where God would meet with His people.

When Did The Church Begin?

Isaiah 2:1-3

WHAT would happen out of Zion? "The law" and "the word of the LORD" would go forth.

Note: Micah 4:1-2 also records this prophecy.

Daniel 2:44

Written around 600 BC. Daniel and others taken captive from Jerusalem to Babylon, where he is prepared to serve the king.

Nebuchadnezzar has a dream and challenges his magicians, wise men, etc. to tell the dream and its interpretation. **Dan. 2:1-13**

Daniel 2:44

Daniel is able to interpret the dream, but attributes it to God.

Daniel 2:19-23, 28



Daniel 2:44

- A statue made of 4 different elements representing 4 kingdoms.
- > The head Babylon (626-539 BC)
- > The chest Medo-Persia (539-331 BC)
- > The belly & thigh Macedonia (~331ff)
- > Legs & feet Rome (~63 BC 100+AD)
- A stone crushes the statue



Daniel 2:44, And in the days of these kings (4th kingdom - TT) the God of heaven will set up a kingdom which shall never be destroyed; and the kingdom shall not be left to other people; it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand forever.



Daniel 2:44

Daniel establishes a timeframe that God

INTENDED to set up His kingdom.

Later, Daniel has more visions about the events of some of these kingdoms.

Joel 2:28-32

- Timing unknown, but likely early (~800 BC).
- Joel addresses a "day of the Lord" (judgment)
- He calls for Israel to repent and notes future plans of the LORD.

Joel 2:28-32

- WHEN it would happen "afterward" (later)
- **WHAT** the Spirit of the LORD poured out
- **WHO** all flesh (not just the Jews). A time of miracles and judgment.
- **WHAT** the ultimate result would be salvation for "whoever calls on the name of the LORD."
- WHERE Mt. Zion and in Jerusalem.

The Church in the Plans of Jesus

While Jesus was on earth, the church was not yet established.

Matthew 3:1-2, John preached "the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (cf. Isaiah 40:3, Malachi 3:1, 4:5-6)

Matthew 4:17, Jesus taught the same thing.

Matthew 6:9-10, "...Your kingdom come..."

The Church in the Plans of Jesus

- While Jesus was on earth, the church was not yet established.
- Matthew 10:7, apostles sent to preach, "the kingdom of heaven is at hand"
- Matthew 16:18-19, "I will build My church... keys to the kingdom..."
- Matthew 16:28, Mark 9:1- during their lifetime.
- Acts 1:4-8, still future. Go to Jerusalem

The Church Established

- Acts 2 records the beginning of the church/kingdom
 The apostles are filled with the Holy Spirit and begin to
 speak in tongues.
- WHAT spoken by Joel (Acts 2:16ff) Joel 2:28-32
- WHEN 2:17, "last days" (Isa. 2:1-3, Micah 4:1, Dan. 2:44)
- WHERE Jerusalem (1:12, 2:5). Isa, Micah, & Joel
- WHEN Rome Dan. 2:44.

The Church Established

- Acts 2 records the beginning of the church/kingdom WHAT a time of great signs.
- Acts 2:31-36, Jesus is made both Lord and Christ. Reigning with God.
- **CONSIDERING** the prophecies and events of **Acts 2**, the NECESSARY CONCLUSION we reach is that this WAS the day the church/kingdom began.

Following Acts 2 the church/kingdom when addressed are spoken of as being in existence.

Acts 2:47, added daily to the church ("their number" - NASB)

Acts 20:28, the church was purchased with His own blood

Various letters addressed to churches in existence

Colossians 1:13, "conveyed into the kingdom of the Son of His love."

Hebrews 12:28, since we are receiving (present tense) a kingdom… "NOTE: "Cannot be shaken"

- cf. Daniel 2:44

- Matthew 26:26-29, consider the Lord's Supper instituted.
- Jesus declares He would not drink with them UNTIL in His Father's kingdom.
- 1 Corinthians 10:16, "communion" is with Christ as we partake
- 1 Corinthians 11:17ff, it was the church partaking of the Lord's Supper

- Matthew 26:26-29, the Lord's Supper instituted
- 1 Cor. 11:26, "till he comes".
- Which is it? Is His kingdom (& church) NOW or will we CEASE to partake when He returns?
- Conclusion: We ARE in His kingdom/church

WHY is this lesson important?

Understanding when the church began helps us understand why we are not under the Old Law anymore (cf. Colossians 2:14)

Many churches (denominations) trace their origins to dates other than Pentecost. IF a church is established later, it CANNOT be the ONE true church (cf. Matthew 16:18)

WHY is this lesson important?

- Premillennialism advocates that the church and kingdom are distinct (some even advocate that the church was an afterthought).
- Understanding when they both began renders this doctrine false.

We know when the church/kingdom began. It remains until the Lord returns and delivers it to the Father (1 CORINTHIANS 15:24-26)
