Journey Through the Bible (24)



Previously

- We continue with our 6th (of 17) time periods of Bible history – the wilderness wanderings
- In our last lesson, we concluded with Israel arriving at Mt. Sinai
- They will spend the next year there as they prepare to enter Canaan (Num. 10:11-12)
- We will "camp" here for a few lessons

God's Covenant – Exodus 19

- Exodus 19:1-2, they arrive in the 3rd month (travel time 45-90 days)
- 19:3-6 Moses speaks to Israel
 - YHWH promises to be His people IF they obey His voice
- 19:7-8 the people accept the covenant!
- 19:10-15 the people are to consecrate themselves. 3 days notice

God's Covenant – Exodus 19

- Exodus 19:16-25, on the 3rd day, the mountain scene was terrifying.
 - Smoke, fire
 - Thundering and lightening
 - A thick cloud
 - Trumpet sounding
- Barriers are put in place
- Moses is told to go warn the people to NOT come near the mountain

The 10 commandments – Exodus 20:1-17

- Exodus 20:1, GOD spoke these words to Israel.
- NOTE: The 10 commandments will become the foundation of their law

(cf. Matthew 22:36-39)

 Begins, "I am the LORD your God", who brought you out of Egypt and bondage

The 10 commandments – Exodus 20:1-17

- Exodus 20:3, You shall have no other gods before Me
- 20:4-6, no carved images
- 20:7, do not take His name in vain
- 20:8-11, Remember the Sabbath alluded to God resting the 7th day after creation
- 20:12, Honor your father and mother

The 10 commandments - Exodus 20:1-21

- Exodus 20:13, you shall not commit murder
- 20:14, do not commit adultery
- 20:15, do not steal
- 20:16, do not bear false witness
- 20:17, do not covet anything
- Exodus 20:18-21, The people respond with great fear

Various laws – Exodus 20:22-23:19

- Exodus 20:22-26, no gods of silver & gold, regulations about altars.
 NOTE vs. 26, no steps (modesty)
- 21:12-14, angry and premediated murder was a capital offense
- 21:15-17, also kidnapping, striking or cursing one's parents
- 21:22-24, if men fight and strike a pregnant woman and the child dies... (the "fetus" was considered a child)

Various laws - Exodus 21-23

- Exodus 21:28-22:15, just laws for dealing animals and property
- 22:16-20, sorcery, bestiality & idolatrous sacrifices death penalty
- 22:22-27, more laws regulating how you treat others, including strangers
- 22:28-31, give God the best and the "first" of both livestock and produce

Various laws - Exodus 21-23:19

- Exodus 23:1-9, act justly toward others, without partiality
- 23:10-13, sabbath years, let the ground rest
- 23:14-19, 3 annual feasts to be observed

The Angel of YHWH- Exodus 23:20-33

- Exodus 23:20-33, He would send an angel to be with them and bring them into the promised land
- 23:24ff, they are again warned to NOT bow down to the Canaanite gods.
 - Promises that if they will serve YHWH, He would bless them.
 - The inhabitants were to be driven out "little by little" so that the land would not become desolate

Affirming the covenant- Exodus 24

- Exodus 24:1-8, Moses speaks to the people and writes down "the words of the LORD" (4) and builds an altar at the foot of the mountain.
- 24:3, 7, the people tell Moses, "All the words which the LORD has said we will do and be obedient".
- 24:5-6 sacrifices are offered & half the blood is sprinkled on the altar
- 24:8 the other half is sprinkled on the people. "This is the blood of the covenant..."

Moses goes on the mountain— Ex. 24:9-18

- Exodus 24:9-11, Moses is with Aaron, Nadab & Abihu & 70 elders of Israel.

 They saw the God of Israel, and ate and drank.
- 24:12-18, Moses is told to come to the LORD on the mountain. He would be given tablets of stone and the law and commandments to teach the people.
- He goes and is there for 40 days and nights
 (18)

We are God's special People

- 19:3-6, if the people obeyed, they would be His people. A kingdom of priests and a holy nation.
- 1 Peter 2:4-5, 9 we are now his holy nation and a kingdom of priests.

God's Holiness made manifest

- 19:16-25, the terrifying scene at Mt. Sinai
- Hebrews 12:28-29 our God is a consuming fire. We must serve Him with reverence & godly fear.

NOTE: Hebrews 12:18-27 refers to our text

What about the 10 commandments today?

- WHICH of the 10 commandments do we keep today?
- NONE! Ephesians 2:14-15, 2 Corinthins
 3:7, etc. they were nailed to the cross.
- HOWEVER, 9 of the 10 commandments are repeated in the New Testament.

What about the 10 commandments today?

- #1 no other gods 1 Corinthians 8:5-6
- #2 no graven images 1 John 5:21,
 cf. Acts 17:24-25
- #3 do not take His name in vain –
 Romans 2:24, 1 Timothy 6:1
- #4 Sabbath ???
- #5 Honor father & mother Ephesians 6:1-

What about the 10 commandments today?

- #6 do not murder Romans 13:9, 1 Peter 4:15,
 Revelation 21:8
- #7 do not commit adultery 1 Corinthians 6:9-10,
 Galatians 5:19
- #8 do not steal Ephesians 4:28, 1 Corinthians
 6:9-10
- #9 do not bear false witness Revelation 21:8,
 Ephesians 4:25
- #10 do not covet Colossians 3:5, Ephesians 5:3-5, Hebrews 13:5, etc.

What about the 10 commandments today?

The ONLY command not repeated in the NT is the Sabbath.

We ARE commanded to assemble on Sunday – Hebrews 10:24-25, Acts 20:7, etc.

NOTE: Never in NT do we read of Christians assembling on Sabbath.

Colossians 2:16 only mention of Sabbath in epistles.

In Acts (9x), every mention involved Paul going to synagogues to teach Jews

Do we set aside a day to remember God?

- The Sabbath Exodus 20:8-11
 God wanted them to take time to stop and worship Him
- Acts 20:7, are we willing to assemble on Sunday (and at other prescribed times)?

Do we regard God as holy?

- Emphasized at Mt. Sinai and throughout our text
- 1 Peter 1:15-16, we are to be holy, even as
 He is holy

The sprinkling of blood

- Exodus 24:7-8 Moses sprinkled the book of the covenant and the people with sacrificial blood
- Hebrews 13:12, we are sanctified with the blood of Jesus. Cf. 1 Peter 1:2, Hebrews 12:22-24, 10:22, etc.
